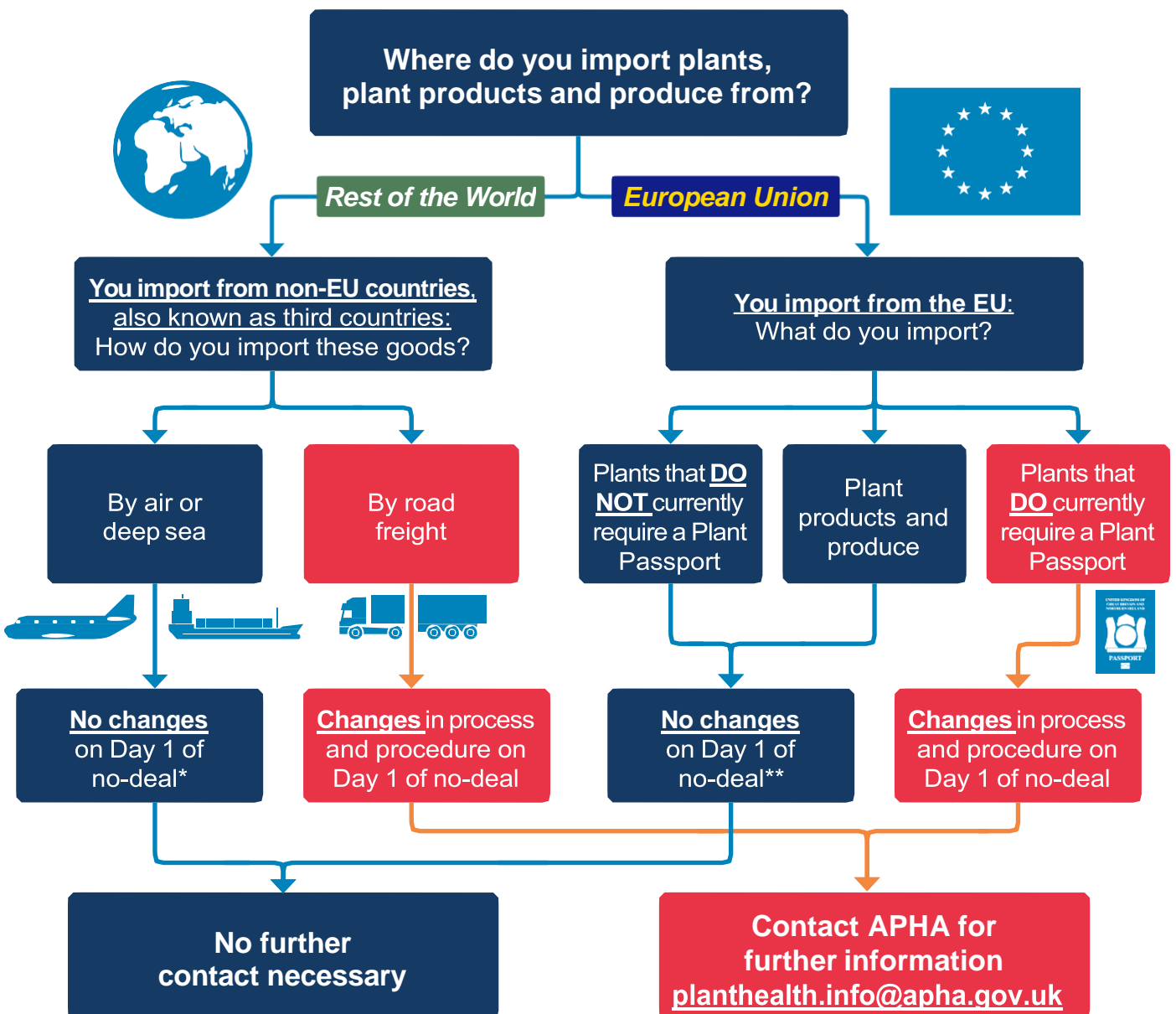




Importing Plants and Plant Products if there's a no deal Brexit

The UK will be leaving the EU on 31 October whatever the circumstances. We would prefer to leave with a deal and we will work in an energetic and determined way to get that better deal. If it is not possible to reach a deal we will have to leave with no deal. We will make all necessary preparations to do so.

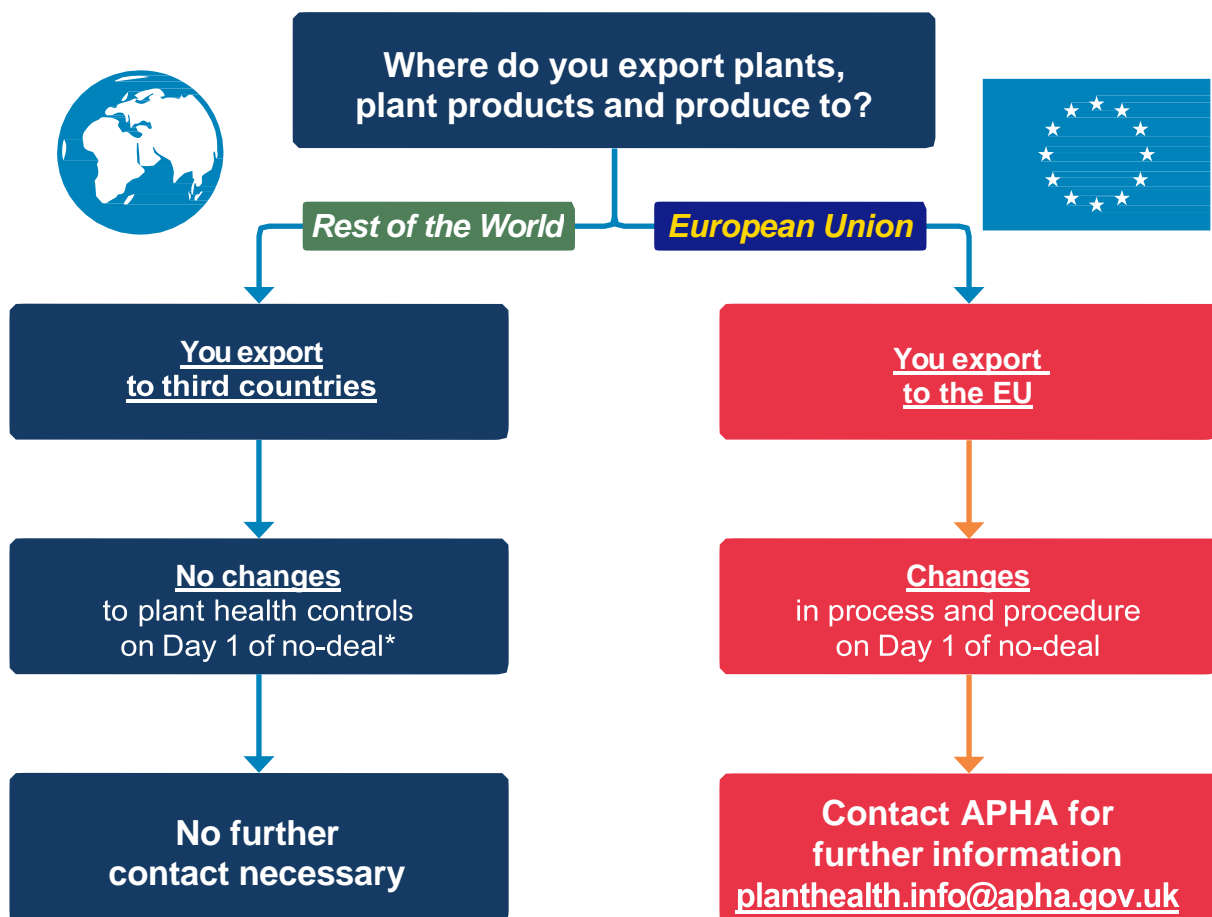
'Plant' means a living plant (including a fungus or tree) or a living part of a plant (including a living part of a fungus or shrub), at any stage of growth. 'Plant product' means products of plant origin, unprocessed or having undergone simple preparation, in so far as these are not plants, including wood and bark.

*Goods receive third country plant health checks at the border as currently.

**No change in procedure – goods do not require any new plant health controls on Day 1.
