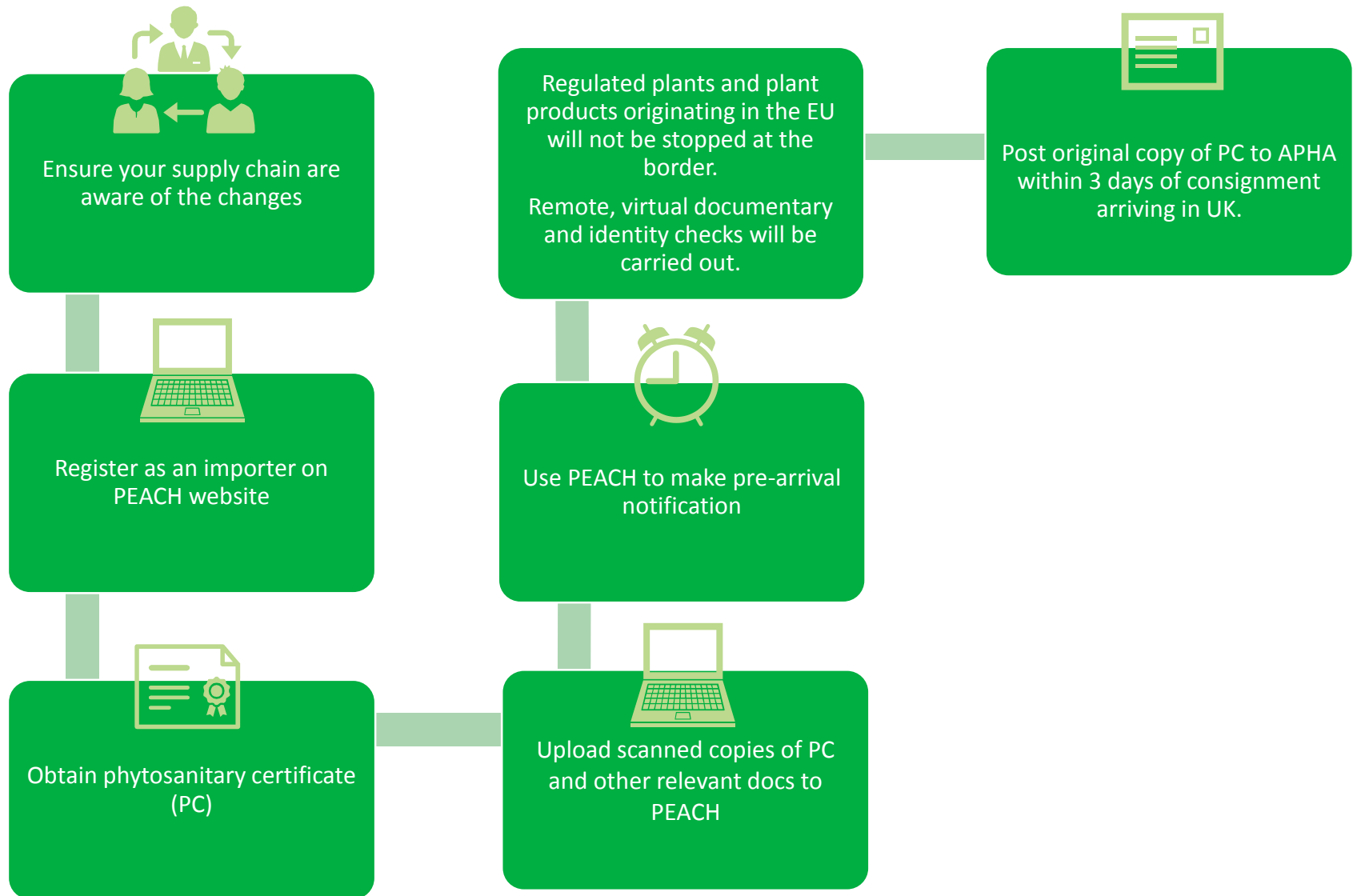

Definition explained

- ‘Plant’ means a living plant (including a fungus or tree) or a living part of a plant (including a living part of a fungus or shrub), at any stage of growth.
- ‘Plant product’ means products of plant origin, unprocessed or having undergone simple preparation, in so far as these are not plants, including wood and bark.

Importing from EU into England and Wales



Exporting from England and Wales into EU



Become familiar with guidance on EU plant health import requirements for 3rd country goods



Check with plant health authority whether a phytosanitary certificate (PC) is required, and whether there are any other requirements (e.g. for testing)



Before export, apply for a PC for your consignment. An inspector will need to come and inspect the consignments before issuing the PC for export.



Register on the eDomero system so that you can apply for a phytosanitary certificate for each consignment of regulated plants and plant products you wish to export
